Did You Know Native Plants...?

- Are hosts for native insects - the main food for baby birds
- Use less water than most non-natives once established
- Are better adapted to local climates
- Resist native pests and diseases better
- Often require less fertilizer - which helps protect water quality

A native plant is one that occurs naturally in a particular habitat, ecosystem, or region without human introduction. It is well adapted to that region's soil, moisture, and weather conditions. Native plants are crucial for native wildlife: they provide food and shelter for 10 to 15 times more species of birds, butterflies, and other native wildlife than non-native plants. By planting native species that provide high quality food sources, nesting habitat, and shelter throughout all seasons of the year, our backyards can serve as important refuges for birds and a vast array of other wildlife.

By following these habitat conservation principles, we can create healthier communities for both wildlife and people:

- Plant Native Species
- Remove Exotic Invasive Plants
- Conserve Water
- Protect Water Quality
- Eliminate or Reduce Pesticide Use

All plants need a little care after transplanting in order to develop a healthy root system. Be sure to provide a bit of supplemental water the first couple of growing seasons. Over time, you will find that most natives, when planted in a favorable site, require little additional attention.
